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New Auburn Public Library Opens


The long-awaited opening of the new Auburn Public Library is scheduled for Wednesday, April 18. The new 24,065 square foot facility is located at the corner of Thach Avenue and Dean Road. Groundbreaking for the \$3.2 million Library building was held on February 14, 2000. Hosey Construction Company of Auburn constructed the new Library facility.

When the doors open on April 18, Auburn citizens will be welcomed to a library twice the size of the present one. There will be enough shelf space to allow for a large expansion of the book collection. Study tables will be placed along the walls of windows and comfortable seating will be located in a conservatory area facing Dean Road. The library will also have a larger storytelling area used for children's programs as well as an area specifically for young adults.

The new facility will also allow for additional computers available for public use. An Electronic Services Librarian will be on staff to assist patrons in the use of these computers. The new library will also house a small computer lab where classes on computer use will be taught. To help pay for these computers and electronic resources, the Library was awarded a \$40,000 grant from the Alabama Public Library Service.

Until the new Library is opened to the public, patrons may continue to return library materials to the outside book drop at the rear of the Ross Street library location. Overdue fines will not be charged on items returned during this time, and library staff will be avail-

able to answer reference questions by phone at 887-4997.

Spotlight:

Auburn Center for Developing Industries

The City's small business incubator facility, Auburn Center for Developing Industries (ACDI), was designed to give small business entrepreneurs a nurturing environment during their early years or during a transition to the Auburn community. ACDI tenants share a wide range of office facilities and services including automated office equipment, secretarial support services, maintenance, utilities, and telecommunication equipment



One of the first three business in-


cubators in Alabama, ACDI began operations on Pumphrey Avenue in December 1988 as a 12,000 square foot multi-tenant building. Since that time, four single-tenant buildings have been added to the complex which now totals 47,600 square feet.

Targeted industry groups include advanced technologies, research and development, assembly, and light manufacturing. Many of ACDI's current and past tenants are companies that have evolved as a result of research begun at Auburn University. Throughout its history, ACDI has housed a total of seventeen companies. Currently, ACDI has six tenants.

Tennis Center is Coming

A master plan has recently been developed for a future tennis complex with clay courts to be located on property donated to the City of Auburn by Cecil M. Yarbrough, III. The property is located on Richland Road and is easily accessible from Shug Jordan Parkway. The total project eventually will consist of 16-20 courts with a control building and parking. The control building will house a pro shop, locker rooms, a players' sitting area, and a snack bar. The consultant for the master planning is Volkert and Associates of Gulf Shores.

Plans call for the complex to be built in two phases with the first phase consisting of the construction of 8-10 clay courts, the control building, and parking. User fees and contributions will be used to finance the project since the City's general fund will not be used. The Parks and Recreation Department, with assistance from the local tennis



association, will soon begin obtaining commitments from local tennis players to purchase annual playing passes. These commitments will be used to amortize revenue bonds issued through the Public Parks and Recreation Authority. Courts will also be available to the public for a daily fee. Contributions toward the project are being accepted and are tax deductible.

Construction of this facility will allow further expansion of the tennis program, provide a first-class facility for local players, and make the City of Auburn more competitive in bidding on national, sectional, and state tennis events.

Auburn CityFest

Activities will include demonstrations by the Auburn University College of Veterinary Medicine Canine Unit, a Southeastern Raptor Rehabilitation Center exhibition sponsored by Craftmaster Printers, several large inflatable games, including a giant slide and a rock climbing wall sponsored by the Alabama Army National Guard. Many of the activities featured in the Children's Station would not be possible without the generous support of Alabama Power.

The SunCom Entertainment Pavilion will showcase



musical entertainment throughout the day. Entertainment acts include Dave Potts, the Tony Brook Band, Shadowood, and Blue Routes. Children will surely enjoy Sunny, the SunCom mascot, who will dance to the beat of the music at the SunCom Entertainment Pavilion.

The Auburn CityFest is a celebration of the Auburn community and is an opportunity for all attendees to enjoy a day at Kiesel Park. Admission to Auburn CityFest is free to the public. 
