Your City Government in Cyberspace

The City of Auburn takes pride in offering its citizens many opportunities to interact with local government. Citizens take part in city council meetings, serve on boards, commissions and committees, and have the opportunity for input in the annual Citizen Survey. Another opportunity for interaction between citizens and their government is provided by the City of Auburn's web site. Whereas many city sites only provide basic information, the City of Auburn's web site provides citizens with a wealth of important information about the City, the City government, and how tax dollars are spent.

The City web site is dynamic, current, and constantly evolving. The City



Council agenda for upcoming council meetings and approved minutes for these meetings are published on the Friday prior to each council meeting. The web site contains the agendas and minutes for every council meeting from January 2000 to the present. Press releases are published regularly. Current job vacancies and job descriptions are posted. Those interested in applying for employment with the City can download an employment application from the web. Citizens are kept up-to-date on current City issues through such links as "Smart Growth" and the "Daily Bulletin" headlines on the front page.

Every City department has a web presence that explains that department's mission, current goals, and budget details. The City of Auburn's entire budget document is posted on the web. A number of forms are available from applications for dog and business licenses to tax forms that you can simply print out and mail in, without ever making a trip to City Hall. Tax information, the City's bond rating, information on bids, and many other finance related topics are also available for review. The Public Works portion of the web page provides weekly updates on construction projects around the City as well as detailed information on the City's engineering standards. Whether you are looking for information on the City library, Citizen Survey results, Parks and Recreation programs, job opportunities, or anything else concerning the City government, you can find it on the City's web site.

A useful government web site must always be a work in progress, especially in a dynamic community like Auburn. Recent additions to the City of Auburn web site include a comprehensive section on local demographics, a section on awards and recognitions that the City has received, and the most current City of Auburn street map. Plans are underway to add interactive maps and improved navigation buttons to make it easier to find everything that the site has to offer. Please keep an eye on www.auburnalabama.org as it evolves.

Mall Boulevard Closing

Street Safety

Summer is here and the usage of golf carts, ATV's, and go-carts continues to rise. To insure safety for everyone, it is important for citizens to understand the operating rules on public roads, including Auburn City streets.



Under Alabama law, a motor vehicle is described as "every vehicle, which is self-propelled." Every person, except those specifically exempted by statutory enactment, must possess a driver's license before driving a motor vehicle upon the highways and streets within this State.

Citizens should be aware that it is against the law for anyone under the age of 16, except with a learner's permit, to operate a motor vehicle on a road. Moreover, section 32-5-65 of the <u>Code of Alabama</u> makes it illegal for any owner or person in charge of a motor vehicle to permit a child under 16 to drive. This is a misdemeanor and punishable by imprisonment for not over 10 days and a fine of not more than \$100.00. Any subsequent convic-

tions carry more harsh penalties.



Also, Alabama law states that any vehicle, which has a maximum speed of 25 mph, must be identified with a reflective device. Motor vehicles must have proper headlights, brake lights, and reflective devices.

City Wins Budget Award

The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) recently announced that the City of Auburn has received the GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for its biennial budget.

The award represents a significant achievement. It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meet the highest principles of governmental budgeting. In order to receive the budget award, the City had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation. These guidelines are designed to assess how well an entity's budget serves as a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guide, and a communications device.

The Government Finance Officers Association is a nonprofit professional association serving 14,000 government finance professionals throughout North America. The GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Awards Program is the only national awards program in governmental budgeting.
