Making Strides to be a Pedestrian-Friendly City

Auburn is a community with a large number of pedestrians. Due to the volume of pedestrian traffic, the City has made several efforts to make Auburn a pedestrian-friendly community. These efforts are shown in the City's ongoing installation of sidewalks and bike lanes, as well as upgrades to crosswalks in the downtown area. However,



drivers are often not alert to pedestrians or bicyclists using crosswalks. Drivers should slow down when approaching a crosswalk, yield to pedestrians, and not attempt to pass in front of or around pedestrians while they are in a crosswalk. Most importantly, obey the posted speed limit. The risk of a pedestrian being seriously injured or killed from a collision rises rapidly with increasing speeds.

In the fall, many citizens enjoy walking for leisure or exercise. Citizens who enjoy walking may keep the following tips in mind for safety:

- If one is available, walk on a sidewalk to be a safe distance from automobile traffic.
- Always walk on your left and face oncoming traffic.
- Wear reflective clothing between the waist and shoulders on the front and back from one-half hour before sunset until one-half hour before sunrise to help drivers identify the presence of a pedestrian. This is a City ordinance.
- Walk with a friend, especially early in the morning and in the evening. If you have to walk alone, call someone and tell them where you are going and when you will be back.
- Vary your schedule or your route.
- Be sure to wait at an intersection for the "walk" signal at a crosswalk.

By working together to ensure that drivers are watchful for pedestrians and walkers follow the suggested safety tips, we can make sure that pedestrians are safe in Auburn. For more information on the City's pedestrian-friendly efforts, contact the Office of the City Manager at 501-7260.

The City of Auburn is now offering a new program for the sale of surplus items. As of July 25, 2005, all surplus property is being sold via the Internet through an on-line auction service, GovDeals. This online auction service will replace the "traditional" auctions held once a year.



Citizens will be offered the opportunity to purchase surplus property year-round. Registration is required for bidding. All items are sold "as is," and acceptable methods of payment include cash, money order, and cashier's check. Please review the terms and conditions before bidding.

Keep Your Trash Pile from Turning into a Pumpkin Patch

The City of Auburn requests that residents place old pumpkins in their City issued roll-out garbage carts instead of placing them in the trash pile at the curb. Pumpkins are considered a food item and must be disposed of in a



sanitary landfill. Trash piles should only consist of discarded shrubbery clippings, grass clippings, weeds, fallen leaves, vines, branches, and limbs. Convenient Ways to Pay Your Water Bill



The Water Works Board offers customers several convenient payment options and locations, including:

• The Bailey-Alexander Complex: Water bill payments can be made at the Water Revenue Office in the new Bailey-Alexander Complex, located at 1501 West Samford Avenue at the intersection of Shug Jordan Parkway and West Samford Avenue, Monday-Friday from 7:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. After hours payments may be left at the drop box located outside the Bailey-Alexander Complex.

• Online: To pay your water bill online, visit the City's website at www.auburnalabama.org and select "Pay my water bill" under the quick links. You will need your customer number and pin number to access your account. The customer number is located on the top right portion of your water bill. The pin number is located beside the customer number. Payments received after 8:00 p.m. CST will be posted to the next business day.

• Bank Draft: If you are interested in paying your bill through monthly bank draft, please call the Water Revenue Office at 501-3050.

• City Hall: Payments may be left in the drop box located inside City Hall at 144 Tichenor Avenue, Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. After hours payments may be left in the drop box located outside City Hall on Tichenor Avenue, across from the Tichenor Avenue entrance to City Hall (near the mailboxes).

All payments left in a drop box must contain the remittance slip and be enclosed in an envelope. Cash payments should not be placed in a drop box; the Water Board cannot be held responsible for cash payments left in a drop box. 
