

Partners in Education: State and Local Officials Prepare for the Opening of Richland Elementary School

On May 6 Auburn City Schools Superintendent Dr. Terry Jenkins conducted a tour of Richland Elementary School for the Auburn City Council. During the tour, Dr. Jenkins highlighted the use of an improved version of the already effective school designs for Yarbrough and Ogletree Elementary Schools to realize a savings in architectural design costs. Richland's campus boasts a number of innovations to this design, including a separate traffic flow for bus traffic and improved security measures ensuring that visitors must enter through the school's front office.

Representative Mike Hubbard has taken a vested interest in the safety of the faculty, staff, parents, and students at Auburn's newest elementary school. Working with the Office of Governor Bob Riley, Representa-

tive Hubbard coordinated with Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) officials to secure the installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of Richland Road and Shug Jordan Parkway prior to the opening of the new school in August. This traffic signal has been a priority for City officials for several months. The City of Auburn would like to express its gratitude to Governor Riley, Representative Hubbard, and ALDOT for their

prompt response to this urgent safety need.

Representative Hubbard has also shown his support for Richland Elementary by securing \$12,000 for the school's TV production studio, aiding in the development of the students' communication and media skills. Over the last several years, Representative Hubbard has provided over \$100,000 in funding for TV studios throughout Auburn City Schools.




Water Works Board Implements Drought Management Plan and Temporary Rates

In the summer of 2007 the Southeast experienced severe drought conditions. Headlines called it the worst drought in decades and predicted that Georgia's Lake Lanier, the main water source for 5 million Atlanta residents, could even run dry. Local conditions were not as critical, but Auburn and the surrounding region were not immune to the effects of this drought, with Lake Martin reaching its lowest level in over 50 years.

Relatively speaking, Auburn's water supply endured the drought better than most reservoirs in the region. Last year, the Water Works Board of the City of Auburn recognized early in the spring that regional rainfall was tracking below normal and began to aggressively manage its resources. Voluntary water restrictions were put in place in August of 2007, and the Water Works Board approved a drought management plan in September of 2007. This plan provides guidelines to help determine the steps that should be taken in each of four drought phases.

Auburn has a sufficient water supply to meet the needs of its customers. However, drought and peak usage demands do stress the system. Year-to-date rainfall totals are well below average and most of Lee County remains in a severe drought accord-





- Customers will not see a rate increase for the water they use up to 4,000 gallons
- Rates for water usage above 4,000 gallons will increase by 20 cents per 1,000 gallons
- Rates for water usage above 20,000 gallons will increase by 28 cents per 1,000 gallons
- If it is necessary to enter a Phase 2 Drought Warning, rates will temporarily increase to further reduce peak water usage.

No community is immune to the effects of long term drought. The Water Works Board is working proactively to manage Auburn's water supply, but it takes all of Auburn's citizens to help conserve our water supply. You can help in a number of ways, including:

- · Water the landscape, and not your street, driveway, or sidewalk. Position your sprinklers so that water lands on the lawn and shrubs and not in paved areas.
- Do not leave sprinklers or hoses unattended.
- · Water during efficient watering times, before 8 a.m. and
- · Check sprinkler and outside water connections for leaks.
- Check irrigation timers and reduce the number of water-
