Senator Shelby Visits Constituents

In February, the City of Auburn and the Auburn Chamber of Commerce hosted Senator Richard Shelby's annual visit to Lee County in the City Council Chamber. Every year, Senator Shelby visits each county to meet with constituents, preview his legislative agenda, and field questions and comments from citizens. Senator Shelby has held over 1400 county visits since his election.

Commenting on the visit, Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. said, "Senator Shelby is a tireless advocate for the citizens of Alabama and his commitment to the City of Auburn and Auburn University is astounding. Senator Shelby successfully worked with our Congressional delegation to secure over \$18 million in funding for the addition of a much-needed third interchange, Exit 50 - Auburn Technology Park Interchange. Senator Shelby has also committed over \$2.9 million in funding for the Auburn-Opelika





Make sure all items are properly contained so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains. Careful placement of your garbage, trash, and recycling

will help ensure your safety and the safety of your neighbors and our collection crews.

Remember that all items for garbage, trash, and recycling collection must be placed at the curb by 6 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. All carts and collection bins must be removed from the curb by 6 a.m. the following day.

Auburn Citizens Approve Special Five Mill Projects

Work begins on Public Improvements

In January, Auburn citizens approved the use of proceeds from the Special Five Mill Tax Fund to provide a number of infrastructure, public works, and facility improvements throughout the City. The measure does not involve the addition of new taxes, but instead authorizes the use of existing tax monies.



Approved projects include:

High Priority Projects

- Donahue Drive/Magnolia Avenue intersection improvements
- FY09 & FY10 Resurfacing and street restriping
- North Donahue Bridge replacement
- · Magnolia Avenue resurfacing and installation of raised crosswalks
- Moores Mill Bridge replacement
- Frank Brown Recreation Center renovation (Phase I)

Supplemental Projects

- Wire Road Bridge replacement
- · Wire Road bikeway
- · Utility asset mapping and maintenance project
- Fire Station No. 6 (cost of land and design)
- Traffic signal at intersection of West Samford Avenue and Shug Jordan Parkway (pending Alabama Department of Transportation approval)
- Mid-block crosswalk solar LED lighting

At press time, the Donahue Drive - Magnolia Avenue Project was out for bid and four additional projects were in the design phase.

Keep Auburn Beautiful *City of Auburn needs your help* to combat litter

The City of Auburn employs a number of measures in its ongoing efforts to keep Auburn beautiful. Street sweeping and right-of-way maintenance crews follow set schedules for the maintenance and cleaning of City property. As an affiliate of the Keep America Beautiful campaign, the City's Keep Auburn Beautiful Committee works to evaluate current City policies on public property maintenance in addition to educating the public on issues such as littering, recycling, and illegal dumping.



Did you know that litter is defined as

anything deposited where it is not meant to be? Common sources of litter include:

- Pedestrians and cyclists who do not use receptacles.
- Motorists who do not use car ashtrays or litterbags.
- Trucks with uncovered loads on local roads and highways.
- · Business dumpsters not properly covered.
- Loading docks and commercial areas with inadequate waste receptacles.
- · Construction and demolition sites without tarps or receptacles for debris and waste.
- · Household garbage scattered before collection.

You can help to minimize litter by setting an example not to litter. Traditionally, the more people litter, the more it becomes a habit. If an area is kept clean, people are less likely to litter.

By setting an example not to litter and utilizing waste and recycling receptacles, we can all do our part to help keep Auburn beautiful. Not only is it the right thing to do, it's the legal thing to do. Upon conviction, the penalty for littering consists of fines up to \$500 and/or 90 days imprisonment.

7th Annual Household Hazardous Waste **Collection Day** Saturday, April 11



ECYCLE The City of Auburn Environmental Services Department will host the 7th AUBURN Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 11 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. at the Environ-

mental Services Complex, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. This annual event offers citizens the opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous household chemicals. Computers and related equipment will also be accepted for recycling during the event.

Participation is limited to Auburn residential solid waste service customers only. Citizens may bring up to 20 pounds of materials per household for disposal. No farm, commercial, or industrial waste will be permitted. Participants are asked to bring a recent water bill to demonstrate proof of residency.


