

Only Rain Goes Down the Drain...

City of Auburn's storm drain marker program educates citizens on the importance of protecting our storm drains



Auburn citizens may have noticed some colorful artwork adorning their neighborhood storm drains. With the help and creativity of students from Auburn City Schools and the Auburn University Sustainability Initiative, the City of Auburn Water Resource Management Department launched its Storm Drain Marker Program in an effort to educate citizens about Auburn's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) and its connection to surrounding bodies of water. The program uses storm drain markers designed by students from Auburn City Schools to remind citizens that rainwater is the only substance that may safely and legally be allowed to enter the storm drain system.

Keeping Auburn's storm sewer system free of debris prevents backups that could lead to flooding along streets and in neighborhoods, and allows rainwater to flow easily through the system. Since water flows from the MS4 into lakes, streams, and rivers, debris or contaminants in the system can also pollute vital water resources. Want

to help keep Auburn's storm drains clear? There are a number of ways you can help:

1. Storm Drain Marker Kits - The City of Auburn Water Resource Management Department offers storm drain marker kits, free of charge, to individuals and civic groups interested in helping us protect our water resources. Each kit contains the materials necessary and instructions to mark several storm drain inlets, as well as educational information on our local watersheds. Storm drain marker kits are the perfect opportunity to earn volunteer hours or fulfill merit badge requirements for organizations.

Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling EventFriday, November 13



The City of Auburn's Environmental Services Department - Recycling Division, in partnership with the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, Sand Hill Recycling, Waste Recycling, and Weston Solutions, will host a FREE, secure document shredding and electronics recycling day on Friday, November 13 from 9 a.m. -

2 p.m. at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce parking lot, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue. This event provides Auburn citizens, businesses, and non-prof-

its the opportunity to properly dispose of outdated, unwanted, or broken electronics and destroy documents in a secure manner. Last year, more than 10,000 pounds of documents were shredded and 15,000 pounds of electronics were collected during the event. This event will be held rain or shine.

Television sets cannot be accepted for recycling during this event. However, Auburn residents may recycle their electronics year-round through curbside collections or at the City of Auburn Environmental Services Department, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. Televisions of all sizes may be left at curbside for collection. Items accepted by appointment only at the Environmental Services Department include computer-related equipment and televisions 19" and smaller. - 2. Yard Debris Containment Items placed for garbage, trash, and recycling collection should be properly contained so they do not fall into the street, street gutters, or down storm drains. Please avoid placing items on or near storm drains, mailboxes, utility poles or boxes, or other fixed objects. Debris deposited in storm drains can clog storm pipes, leading to flooding during storm events, and can contribute to polluting our vital water resources.
- 3. Illicit Discharge Reporting The City of Auburn's Illicit Discharge Ordinance prohibits the deposit of materials other than stormwater into the City's storm sewer system. Examples of illicit discharges include, but are not limited to, dumping paint, concrete, grass clippings, or oil down a storm drain. If you suspect a violation, please contact the City of Auburn Water Resource Management Department at webwtrswr@auburnalabama.org or call 501-3060. Please provide your name, address, phone number, location or address of the suspected violation, the type of problem, the date of the occurrence, and the name of the individual/company suspected of being involved. FEMA Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study Update

90-Day Appeal and Protest Period Underway

Lee County and the City of Auburn are in the process of updating their Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study. Property owners affected by the proposed floodplain have been notified by mail. FEMA has initiated the 90-day appeal and protest period. Property owners interested in drafting an appeal or protest are encouraged to contact the City of Auburn Public Works Department prior to submitting an appeal. The 90-day appeal and protest period will end on November 2. The proposed maps are scheduled to go into effect in July 2010.
