

Representative Mike Hubbard Secures Community Service Grant for Auburn Fire Division

Representative Mike Hubbard recently secured a Community Service Grant through the State of Alabama to provide communication equipment for the City of Auburn Public Safety Department - Fire Division. The grant, totaling \$6,000, will be used to provide hand-held, digital walkie talkies for Auburn Fire Division personnel. The

upgraded equipment will assist the City in complying with new FCC requirements for radios, effective January 1, 2013. Representative Hubbard was on-hand at the October 20 City Council meeting to present the check to Mayor Bill Ham, Jr., Public Safety Director Bill James, and Fire Chief Lee Lamar.

Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. commented, "Supplying our first responders with the equipment they need to serve the citizens of Auburn is of the utmost importance. We appreciate Representative Hubbard's continued support of the City of Auburn's mission to provide quality services to our citizens."



North College Historic District Improvements

The lights are shining brightly along North College Street these days thanks to the recently-completed

North College Historic District Improvements Project. This Historic District project, totaling \$200,000, called for the installation of 42 decorative street lights and custom street name and speed limit signs along portions of North College



Street, Gay Street, Drake Avenue, Bragg Avenue, and Mitcham Avenue. The new street name signs feature the current street name, along with the street's historic name. The Auburn City Council, in cooperation with the Historic Preservation Commission, authorized expenditures for

the project at the May 19 Council meeting. Funds had been budgeted for this purpose from the 2004 Capital Projects Fund. Work began in June and was completed in time for Auburn to host the Alabama Historical Commission's 41st Annual Preservation Conference in October.

FEMA Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study Update

Proposed maps scheduled to go into effect in July 2010

Lee County and the City of Auburn are in the process of updating their Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study. Property owners affected by the proposed floodplain have been notified by mail. The 90-day appeal and protest period, required by FEMA, ended on November 2. The proposed maps are scheduled to go into effect in July 2010.

Frying a Turkey for the Holidays?

Recycle your grease through the City's Cooking Oil/Grease Recycling Program



If your holiday plans include frying a turkey, don't pour the leftover grease down the drain, recycle it through the City of Auburn's Cooking Oil/Grease Recycling Program. To participate, simply

pour any used cooking oil (after it has cooled) into its original, leak-proof container and drop it off at the RecycleAuburn Drop-Off Center, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. While you're there, pick up a new, empty container for future use, courtesy of the City of Auburn. Properly disposing of used cooking oil/grease is good for the environment and helps prevent costly sewer blockages and potential sewer spills.

City of Auburn Offers New Street Routing Web Application

Motorists and cyclists can now map best routes to favorite locations



Looking for the most efficient route when dropping your children off at school? Planning your commute by bicycle and want the safest route to travel utilizing Auburn's Bicycle Network? Auburn motorists and cyclists now have a new tool to help identify the most efficient routes

around town thanks to a new street routing web site created by the City of Auburn Information Technology Department - Geographic Information System (GIS) Division. Using the City's extensive GIS data and taking into account the latest City street closings and detours, users can locate the best route between points anywhere in the City. The application allows users to find the fastest, shortest, or for cyclists, safest, route to any number of stops. There is even an option that allows you to create your own barriers so the application will know that you want to avoid certain roads or paths.

Log on to www.auburnalabama.org/maps/Interactive to use the application and select the street routing map link. Using the search box, enter the address or intersection of a location in the City and click search. The application will generate a "stop" on the map for each address entered. Alternatively you can just click on the map to place a stop. Once you have selected your destinations, click the "get route" button to generate directions. Users may select routes based on shortest drive time, shortest distance, or traveling by bicycle.

The City of Auburn Information Technology Department - GIS Division creates and maintains Auburn's extensive GIS network. Since its creation in 2001, the City's GIS Division has become a leader in GIS applications and technology throughout the State of Alabama and across the nation. Auburn's GIS applications are frequently featured at conferences and workshops hosted by ESRI, the world leader in GIS modeling and mapping software.
