




Bridge Replacement Projects Slated for 2010 Traffic on Wire Road and North Donahue Drive to be detoured

In 2010, the City of Auburn will move forward with two bridge replacement projects representing an investment totaling more than \$2.8 million in infrastructure improvements. The contract for the Wire Road Bridge Replacement Project was approved by the City Council at its December 1, 2009 meeting. Contracts for the North Donahue Bridge Replacement and North Donahue Drive Widening Projects were scheduled to go before the City Council for consideration in January. In addition to the enhanced safety provided by modern bridge structures, these projects will help enhance traffic flow and reduce congestion along these routes.



Construction on the **Wire Road Bridge Replacement Project** was slated to begin January 11 and continue for 90 calendar days. The anticipated completion date is mid-April. The project consists of replacing the existing bridge crossing Choctafaula Creek with a wider bridge that includes two 12-foot lanes for traffic with two-foot shoulders and a protected multi-use path for pedestrian and bicycle traffic. This project will also include the extension of the existing portion of the Wire Road Bikeway across the bridge, to Chadwick Lane. During construction, the bridge will be closed to traffic. A detour route will be available from Wire Road to Webster Road, onto Alabama Highway 14, to Chadwick Lane, back to Wire Road. A detour map is available on the City of Auburn's website at www.auburnalabama.org.



The North Donahue Bridge Replacement and Widening Projects are scheduled to get underway in mid-February and are expected to be completed in February 2011. The projects consist of replacing the existing bridge over Saugahatchee Creek and widening North Donahue Drive from north of the bridge to Farmville Road. The existing two-lane bridge will be replaced with a threelane bridge and include a protected multi-use path for pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The bridge will be raised vertically nine feet to meet Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements. The City of Auburn and Lee County will each participate in the funding for construction of the bridge. Roadway improvements will be completed concurrently with the bridge replacement and will be funded entirely by the City. The portion of North Donahue from north of the bridge to Crescent Boulevard

will be widened from 21 to 24 feet and the portion from Crescent Boulevard to Farmville Road will be widened to accommodate three lanes of traffic. During construction, the North Donahue Bridge will be closed and traffic will be detoured to North College Street. CompPlan 2030 Update

Development of CompPlan 2030, the City of Auburn's new comprehensive plan, is continuing. Approximately 80 people attended the first public meeting in October 2009 to offer their input on Auburn's future. The next phase of input involves meetings with various stakeholder organizations to seek input on a variety of issues. Meetings will be organized around issue areas, and organizations with interests or responsibilities related to each issue area will be invited. For example, for the water quality issue area, invitees will include local, state, and federal government agencies, Auburn University-associated institutes, and non-profits that advocate for protection of water quality. Input from these issues and needs meetings, as well as from the first public meeting, will be available for review at the second public meeting. The date for Public Meeting #2 is anticipated to be sometime during the latter part of February 2010.
