Auburn Police Chief Retires; Successor Selected

In June, Auburn City Manager Charles M. Duggan, Jr. announced the appointment of Paul Register as Auburn's Police Chief following Chief Tommy Dawson's retirement. Police Chief Paul Register has been Acting Police Chief since Chief Dawson began a medical leave in March. "We're fortunate to have someone with Chief Register's experience and ability to lead our Police Division," said City Manager Duggan.

In his 25 years with APD, Chief Register has served in leadership positions in the patrol, detectives and vice and narcotics sections before being promoted to Assistant Chief of Police in 2010. Register holds a Bachelor of Science in Justice and Public Safety from Auburn University at Montgomery, is a 2012 graduate of the FBI National Academy at Quantico, Virginia and is currently pursuing a Master of Science in Homeland Security/Emergency Management.

Retiring Police Chief Dawson joined the Auburn Police Division almost 26 years ago. He holds a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Faulkner University and is a 2006 graduate of the FBI National Academy. He is the son of Reverend Henry and Patsy Dawson, and has one daughter with his wife of 25 years. Dawson publicly announced his struggle with Parkinson's Disease when he received the Auburn Chamber of Commerce Chairman's award earlier this year.

"Our thoughts and prayers are with Chief Dawson as he works to stay as healthy as possible," said Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. "Tommy has been an outstanding police chief whose leadership in the community and on campus will be sorely missed. We wish him the best in his well-earned retirement."



Master Plan to Address Future of Downtown

The retail and historic heart of Auburn will be the focus of a series of public forums scheduled for late summer. The goal of the public input is the development of a Downtown Master Plan that will enhance Downtown Auburn's attractiveness and viability.

Initial considerations for the plan include expanding the current urban core southward and westward, developing a unified vision of downtown and downtown branding, and reconfiguring the Toomer's Corner intersection to complement planned changes to the University corner of the intersection. The resulting plan will include a renewed vision for downtown growth potential, land use, urban design, parking, and transportation.

The Downtown Master Plan is being developed by Urban Collage, an Atlanta-based design consultant. Known for excellence in engaging civic participation, Urban Collage will conduct innovative public forums that will involve Auburn's citizens throughout the planning process. Workshops, community meetings, interviews, design charettes, and surveys will allow a variety of stakeholders the chance to comment on design elements and help direct the development of the plan.

The development of the Downtown Master Plan will be overseen by a project steering committee comprised of City Council members, Planning Commission members, city staff, and community representatives. Public meetings for the project are scheduled to begin in late summer. How Many Roommates May I Have?

A Reminder of the City of Auburn's Residential Occupancy Regulations

Each fall, Auburn welcomes thousands of new and returning students. In an effort to maintain the character of single-family neighborhoods, the City of Auburn sets limits on residential occupancy in the City limits. Traditional residential neighborhoods are typically zoned to allow for no more than two unrelated persons residing at an address. Apartment complexes, mobile home parks, and other multi-family housing units are zoned to allow for more than two unrelated tenants.

If you're unsure about the zoning for your neighborhood, visit the City's website at www.auburnalabama.org/students and click "Occupancy."

Property owners found to be in violation of occupancy regulations are subject to fines and possible jail time, as set forth in the City of Auburn Zoning Ordinance. Residents in violation of residential occupancy regulations may be subject to eviction by property owners.

City Monitors Mosquito Density

Protect yourself and your neighbors by reporting mosquito problems to the City of Auburn Environmental Services Department. Since May 2012, Environmental Services employees have responded to 159 mosquito nuisance complaints. When mosquito populations are reported, the location is tracked using GIS mapping which helps identify larger populations of mosquitoes. Mosquito gravid traps are occasionally set to trap egg-carrying mosquitoes, and spray efforts are targeted at "hot spots" instead of using a blanket spray applied to the entire city.

The microbial larvicide used in the City's mosquito control program is *Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis* (Bti), a naturally occurring soil bacterium registered for control of mosquito larvae. Extensive testing by the EPA shows that Bti is non-toxic to humans and poses no risk for wildlife, non-target species or the environment.

City of Auburn Storm Drain Marking Project

As a part of its ongoing education and outreach initiatives, the City of Auburn's Water Resource Management Department (WRM) encourages citizens to participate in its Storm Drain Marking Project. This project involves placing watershed-specific markers on stormwater inlets throughout the City. The marker placement educates residents about the connection existing between our storm sewer system and the surrounding water bodies and emphasizes the importance of stormwater management. Citizens may participate in one of two ways: 1) organize installation of markers with assistance from WRM staff or 2) request Storm Drain Marker Kits and install them at your convenience. This is a rewarding activity for citizens of all ages and helps educate the public about our local environment. Sales Tax Holiday

As students head back to school this fall, Auburn's parents will enjoy savings on many back to school necessities. At the April 14, 2013 City Council meeting the Auburn City Council approved an ordinance authorizing Auburn's Sales Tax Holiday Weekend. The Sales Tax Holiday will begin Friday, August 2 at 12:01 a.m. and end on Sunday, August 4 at midnight.

Items exempt from state and city sales tax fall into 3 major categories:

Clothing – "All human-wearing apparel suitable for general use" is exempt unless it otherwise appears on the taxable list; clothing items must cost \$100 or less per article of clothing to be exempt.

Computers, Computer Software, and School Computer Supplies – A single purchase with a sales price of \$750 or less will be exempt. Exempt items include computers, computer software and any item commonly used by a student in a course of study in which a computer is used.

School supplies – All items of \$50 or less per item commonly used by a student in a course of study will be exempt. Supplies may include art supplies, reference maps and globes, textbooks on an official school book list with a sales price of more than \$30 but less than \$50, and books with a sales price of \$30 or less per book. An all-inclusive list of exempt school supplies may be found on the City's web site at www.auburnalabama.org.

Items not exempt during the Sales Tax Holiday Weekend include:

Clothing accessories such as handbags, jewelry, sunglasses, umbrellas. Protective equipment such as breathing masks, hard hats, helmets, and safety belts. Sports or recreational equipment such as athletic gloves, goggles, shin guards, ballet or tap shoes. Furniture, any systems, devices, software, or peripherals designed or intended primarily for recreational use, video games. Magazines, newspapers, periodicals, or any other document printed or offered for sale in a non-bound form.
