#### Auburn 2040 kicks off this July

After being delayed more than a year because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Auburn 2040 community planning initiative will restart this summer.

Each generation, Auburn residents have a chance to shape the future of our community. In the 1980s, community members gathered to envision and create a road map for how to make their dreams for Auburn become reality. That initiative birthed the Auburn 2000 plan. Decades later, a new group of residents embarked on another goal-setting initiative to create the Auburn 2020 plan.

Since then. Auburn has seen so much of what was laid out in those plans come to fruition.

Now, we're gearing up for another round of planning, and we need your help.

Applications will remain open until Sunday, June 13. Once team members have been finalized, teams will meet to kick off the process on Thursday, July 15, at 5:30 p.m. at the Auburn High School auditorium. Teams will meet into the fall a minimum of two-three times a month. We anticipate the finalized Auburn 2040 plan to go before the City Council for adoption in early 2022.

#### A better way to get rid of used cooking oil

Over the years, we've kept more than 13,000 gallons of used cooking oil and grease out of the City's sewer system through our Fats, Oil and Grease (FOG) Recycling program. And you can help us collect even more!

Our Water Resource Management Department began the FOG Recycling program in 2009 to bring awareness to the harmful effects of the improper disposal of grease and used cooking oil. Through this program, residents are reminded that oil should never be poured down the drain. Even if oil is poured slowly down the drain with hot water, this will eventually cause problems with your plumbing and the City's sewer system as a whole.

The program offers a responsible means of recycling, providing plastic containers that customers can pick up from the Recycling Drop-Off Center at 365-A N. Donahue Drive. Once full, customers can bring the containers back to the drop-off center to be properly disposed. A grease renderer turns the recycled oils into raw materials that can be used in animal feeds, pet food and industrial formulations.

Each year, the Water Works Board of the City of Auburn (AWWB) distributes its Drinking Water Consumer Confidence Report to notify customers about the quality and safety of their drinking water. This year's report is now available online at auburnalabama.org/waterresource-management/water-operations.

The report provides information about the contaminants that may be found in the drinking water and how these contaminants may affect customers' health. It is also an opportunity for our customers to learn about Auburn's drinking water sources, treatment techniques and delivery methods used to ensure compliance with state and federal laws.

A copy of the report has been mailed to all customers. The AWWB provides a digital copy of the report online, and print copies are available at the Bailey Alexander Water and Sewer Complex and other public facilities in Auburn. Have guestions? 

#### **BACK TO SCHOOL SALES TAX HOLIDAY**

**JULY 16-18** 

The 2021 Back to School Sales Tax Holiday is set for July 16-18, giving shoppers the chance to purchase certain items free of state and local sales tax. On May 4, the Auburn City Council approved an ordinance exempting specific items from the City's 4% sales tax, including clothing, computers and computer software, school supplies and books.
