Auburn now seventh-largest city in 🚄

The results are in from the 2020 Census, and the city of Auburn is now the seventh-largest Alabama city with 76,143 residents.

Auburn has grown nearly 43% since 2010 when the city had a population of 53,380, according to census data. At that time, our Planning Department staff estimated that Auburn's population was significantly higher than the census results. Our estimates continued to run higher than the U.S. Census Bureau's figures throughout the decade.

"While we have certainly seen significant growth, it's possible that what we believed to be an undercount in 2010 has somewhat corrected itself in the 2020 census," said City Manager Megan McGowen Crouch.

Auburn is the fastest growing of Alabama's top 25 largest cities and the fourth fastest growing city in the state since 2010. Gulf Shores was the fastest growing (57%) followed by Fairhope (47%) and Chelsea (47%). Lee County also grew over the last decade, increasing by 24% to 174,241.

"Our approach over the past few decades has been to maintain and improve our economy and quality of life rather than to actively seek growth. What's important to us is that we provide the best schools and public safety along with great entertainment and recreation opportunities for those who call Auburn home," said Auburn Mayor Ron Anders. "I believe this growth is evidence that people love living in Auburn, and we're seeing that more people want to be a part of that. We're happy to welcome more to the Auburn family and look forward to the future we will build together."

AUBix bringing \$120M data center to Auburn

We're excited to announce that AUBix LLC plans to open a \$120 million data center in Auburn that will benefit communities across the state by providing a technological edge to businesses and individuals as well as enhanced access to high-speed internet.

Founded by Auburn businessmen, AUBix LLC will build and operate the multi-tenant data center.

"Our goal is to provide customers with secure and compliant infrastructure to host internet

applications locally, as well as significantly higher internet speeds and the choice of national/global carriers who compete for their business," said Andrew Albrecht, co-founder and CEO of AUBix. "In turn, that will attract new businesses to the state, support all levels of academic initiatives and research, and bring value to the communities we serve."

AUBix is expected to become an economic catalyst for the regions and communities it serves, enabling digital transformation for businesses, supporting academic research and development, and providing access to high-speed internet.

One key benefit AUBix will bring to businesses is increased access to global internet exchanges through multiple highspeed fiber networks. AUBix will become an internet exchange for the existing network service providers in the area, enabling them to leverage their high-speed regional and global networks and improve the performance of internet applications.

"The additional capacity and services AUBix will bring to local business and educational institutions is as groundbreaking as when Interstate 85 was built in the 1960s," Auburn Mayor Ron Anders said. "Auburn will now be able to better serve IT-related business enterprises and, with that, bring desirable, knowledge-based, high-paying jobs to Auburn. On top of that, the significant revenue this project will bring will greatly benefit our school system, which we all value. I am grateful for the trust and investment of the owners and their partners in our community."

AUBix will offer 22,000 square feet of available data center space and more than 3 megawatts of critical power capacity across two data halls with redundant power and cooling. The initial 40,000-square-foot buildout includes customer office space, conference rooms and tenant equipment storage.

DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITING

Do you ever wonder if that door-to-door salesperson is legitimate? Under section 16-29 of the Auburn City Code, a solicitor must be registered with the City of Auburn prior to going door-to-door. Each registered solicitor must have a photo ID permit badge as evidence of having registered with the City's Revenue Office.

Solicitors are given the following guidelines by which to abide while they are conducting business in Auburn:

- If any home or neighborhood displays a "No Soliciting" placard, solicitors must discontinue any efforts to solicit and may not leave any literature concerning the solicitation at that residence or in that neighborhood.
- Any solicitor who is asked to leave any residence by the occupant shall immediately and peacefully depart.
- · Every solicitor shall carry a permit in plain sight while soliciting within City limits. The same shall be visible about the body of said solicitor so as to be seen by any police officer or by any person who is solicited.
- · Solicitation is permitted during the following hours only:
- September through May: 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- June through August: 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- Sundays year-round: Noon to 6 p.m.

No door-to-door solicitation shall be conducted on City holidays.
